Tranquillity is not conventionally a trait associated with workspaces but this family office designed by Right Angle Studio in Singapore aspires for that. From the entrance to the inner sanctums of this modestly sized office, every element is conceived to afford the users a sense of wellbeing and calm for efficacious administrative work.

Screens, applied in manifold ways, are a key device to balance privacy and engagement. The open plan office employs louvred shutters inspired by Straits Chinese houses with rattan screens to reflect the client's business origins from Indonesia, where the material is commonly found in the vernacular architecture.

As the brief from the client called for an open-plan layout for all staff with the exception of the director, the design team introduced rattan panels as an elegant screening device.

The warm, natural palette continues into the director's office, bridging the room with the rest of the office in a harmonious way.
