Perched on the sloping terrain of Thomson Hills, Hill House by Right Angle Studio rethinks the semi-detached typology through a layered interior landscape shaped by topography, daylight, and daily movement.

Spanning 6,000 square feet, the home is organised as a series of staggered levels that make transitions feel gradual, defined by changing perspectives, shifting ceiling heights, and moments of openness that connect the family to the outdoors.

The planning reverses expectations by positioning the main living areas on higher ground, while the dining and kitchen zones sit lower on the site. This creates a lived-in progression through the home: arrival leads to grounded, functional spaces before opening up toward elevated areas designed for gathering and relaxation. Large window openings frame the living space, softening the divide between inside and outside while pulling in abundant natural light. With breezes able to pass through generously, the interior benefits from natural ventilation as part of a broader environmentally responsive approach.
