In response to Singaporeans ranking third globally for sleep deprivation, Right Angle Studio undertook a self-commissioned project focused on enhancing rest. Despite limited space of 10.64 square meters, they created a luxurious sleeping environment centred on geometric precision. The room features elevated wardrobes framing a raised bed platform, beneath which lies a minimalist garden of desert plants and stones, bringing nature into the space. A Douglas fir ledge, combined with Himalayan green onyx, adds visual fluidity. The bed is surrounded by refined details, including Le Corbusier lamps and a light onyx backdrop. Opposite, a Venetian plastered artwork contrasts with a textured stone wall, embodying the wabi-sabi philosophy. The project, titled Resting Rights, emphasises the importance of restful sleep and tranquility.
